

Terms and Conditions to Nigeria Price Lock

1. These are the terms and conditions for the Nigeria Price Lock ("**Campaign**") as conducted by MultiChoice Nigeria Limited and its partners, co-promoters, sponsors, directors, officers, employees, agents and representatives ("**MultiChoice**").  - 4.2. pay your monthly subscription fees before your due date within the Validity Period to be eligible for this Campaign;

For instance, if our Validity Period is effective 01 February to 31 July 2022, and as a premium subscriber, your January subscription expires on 03 February 2022. You can renew your subscription any day before 03 February 2022 to lock in your current subscription for the Validity Period, in so long as your subscription is renewed before the 3rd of every subsequent month;

- 4.3. Or, pay outrightly, your 12 months' subscription fees before your due date or on the commencement day of the Validity Period; and
- 4.4. continue to stay active during the Validity Period to be eligible.

This means that you must **remain active without disconnecting your subscription during the Validity Period** to be eligible to qualify for this Campaign.

5. If you disconnect at any stage during the Validity Period, you will no longer be eligible to participate in this Campaign and will be subject to the applicable subscription fees.
